Program Overview



Grants Activities

- Emphasis on innovative research that does not duplicate research elsewhere
- Emphasis on collaboration (also cross-sector)
- Emphasis on leverage of grant funds
- Emphasis on the California epidemic

Note that a new strategic plan covering the next four years has been released.



Call for Applications Overview

- Reflects the CHRP Strategic Plan, including Stakeholder Input
- Strategically targets research (Demo projects for TLC+ and PrEP)
- Letter of Intent required



Key Provisions of the Call

- Projects must address both TLC+ and PrEP
- Applicants may apply as a single institution or a lead institution with other partner institutions
- Either a 501(c)(3) community-based organization or a local health jurisdiction must be included in a consortium, or must be the applicant for a single institution application
- Study population requirements



Key Provisions of the Call (cont.)

- Gilead Sciences will provide ARVs for the PrEP arm, pending IRB approval of protocols
- Non-UC institutions can request up to 25% of direct costs for indirect costs, flexibility in allocation among non-UC institutions
- Funds may be allocated for testing and outreach or each study arm as appropriate



Award Amount, Duration, and Requirements

- Up to \$1.2 million per year in total direct costs for each award
- Up to 3 awards (intend to fund at least one in Northern CA and at least one in Southern CA, if justified by merit
- Up to 4 year proposed duration
- Indirect Costs: Up to 25% for non-University of California institutions
- One institution takes the lead in preparing and submitting application materials, including the LOI, for multi-institutional proposals
- If applying as a consortium, the lead institution will receive and administer funds
- Project Directors
 - Single Project Director with PI status (at lead institution if applying as a consortium)
 - Single co-Project Director from each additional institution, if applicable
 - Minimum 1.2 person months effort



Peer Review Process

An in-person study section meeting will be held in the SF Bay Area

<u>Important Feature:</u> Community Reviewers will participate in the peer review process

Merit Review Criteria Summary

- Overall Strength and feasibility
- Experience and capacity for evaluation
- Qualifications of the investigators and the research environment
- Capacity and readiness to implement proposed activities
- Qualifications and experience in TLC+ components
- Feasibility of the workplan to provide practical information for wider implementation
- Inclusion of populations most highly impacted by HIV
- The capacity to form a Community Advisory Board



The Research Grant Programs Office Contracts and Grants Unit

- Created February 1, 2011

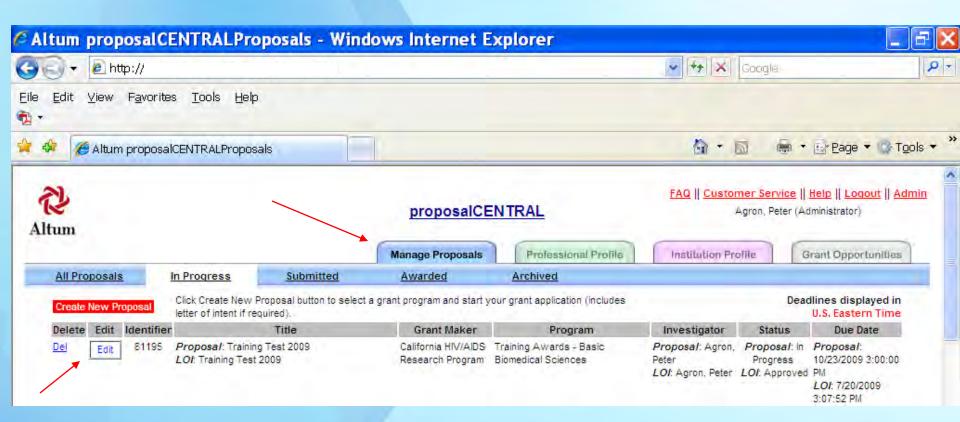
Letters of Intent

Required as a prerequisite for all applications

- a. Information is entered on-line
- b. <u>Letter of Intent Narrative</u>
 - Prepared off-line according to the instructions
 - Basic description of personnel, institution(s) and project
 - Rolling approvals: get it in early (& before noon Tuesday, October 11)
- c. Reviewed by CHRP for eligibility
- d. Approval provides access to application materials and pages TIPS:
- Follow the instructions and guidelines, use template provided
- For submission on proposalCENTRAL, Project Director/Applicant must initiate the LOI, then can enable access by others to delegate tasks
- Recommend that Project Director/Applicant provide access to collaborators on proposalCENTRAL



From Approved LOI to Application:



LOI Deadline: Tuesday, Oct. 11th, before noon Pacific Time



Important Dates

- October 11, 2011: LOI due before noon, Pacific Time.
- November 17, 2011: Applications due before noon, Pacific Time.
- March 2012: Funding notification
- April 1, 2012: Award start date
