Call for Applications Overview

Summary Purpose

California

Research Program

- Funding Tiers
 - Urban County Tier I. \$750,000 to \$1,200,000 for 36 months in direct costs.
 - Rural County Tier II. Up to \$300,000 for 36 months in direct costs.
 - Sites in rural counties eligible to apply for Tier I if meet eligibility requirements for *Populations Served*.
 - Indirect Costs. Up to 25% for non-University of California Applicants.

Organization and Purpose

- Organization of the initiative: Role of UCSF
- Focus of research
- Research rationale and framing
 - PCMH model components and activities



Eligibility Requirements

- Single Institution vs. Lead Institution and consortium of agencies
- Funding Tier exemption: rural counties can apply for Tier I if meet the Population Served requirement.
- Consortium as a whole can meet requirements.
- Populations Served: persons currently served.
- Participants represent populations most highly impacted by HIV, particularly those with a history of health disparities and inequities in accessing HIV services, and/or over the age of 50.
- Documentation required in the application, not in the LOI.
- Electronic Health Record system requirement.



Proposed Use of Funds

Research Collaboration

- 30% of direct costs reserved for data collection and analysis.
- Example for 3/yr grant:
 \$900,000 Total Direct Costs
 270,000 30% Reserve for Data Collection and Analysis

EHR Systems

- Single Institutions
- Consortium
- Transitional Protocols



Proposed Use of Funds

- PCMH Model Development
 - In addition to electronic exchange of information.
 - Does not include funding for patient care or prevention.
- Dissemination
- Participation in Collaborative Meetings



Mechanisms of Support

- The project start date is September 1, 2010, and the project period will span 36 months (3 years), ending August 31, 2013.
- It is the intent to fund at least one meritorious Institution or Lead Institution and Consortium each from Northern and Southern California.
- Intent to ensuring a sufficient sample size with demographic diversity.
- Grants are one-time, non-renewable grants.



Merit Review Criteria

- Experience and capacity to collect relevant data and collaborate with researchers.
- Documentation of meeting the eligibility requirements outlined in this Call for Applications.
- Capacity and readiness to implement proposed activities.
- Qualifications and experience in providing various components of a PCMH for persons with HIV/AIDS or other chronic diseases.
- Feasibility of the proposed plan to establish and/or improve the electronic exchange of health information with other providers in an effort to increase access to services, improve health outcomes, and enhance service coordination for the HIV/AIDS population identified to be served.



Merit Review Criteria Cont.

- Feasibility of the proposed capacity building plan and likely effectiveness in strengthening a PCMH for the HIV/AIDS population identified to be served.
- Inclusion of populations most highly-impacted by HIV, particularly those with a history of health disparities and inequities in accessing HIV services and/or those with HIV/AIDS over the age of 50.
- Extent to which the results will contribute to advancing PCMHs that can be replicated in California and how results will be disseminated.



Important Dates

- March 23: LOI due before noon, Pacific Time
- April 30: Applications due before noon, Pacific Time.
- Mid-July: Funding notification
- September 1: Award start date



Letters of Intent

- Required as a prerequisite for all applications
 - Reviewed for Eligibility/Responsiveness to the Call

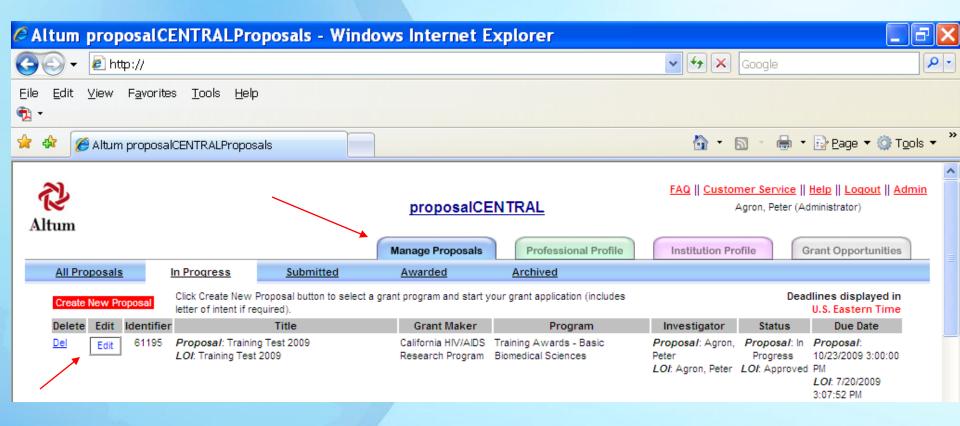
Follow the instructions

- Applicant/Lead Applicant institution must have an Institution Profile (including Federal Tax ID)
